Dear Friends,

As I write this letter we have just completed the strangest month of April that I know of. To begin, Easter Sunday was on April 1st and the last time that that had happened was before I was born. Then we had a blizzard when things should be greening up. As I write this letter, with the snow on the ground it looks like the middle of February and we should be getting ready for Lent, but Easter was just completed. Furthermore, I have already attended a Brewer regular season home game! Yes, the roof was closed.

These events have made me "practice what I preach" regarding being anxious. I am not one who likes to cancel church and if I do what does that mean for things that are scheduled like birthday party's, baptisms and preaching schedules? Fortunately decisions and events like this do not happen all that often. In the end these are things I cannot control and it seems that things usually work out.

That being said, I read in my devotional reading recently something similar on this topic. Exodus 14:13 says, "Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today." Has there ever been a time when you have been confronted with circumstances and extraordinary difficulties? Have you ever felt trapped when you cannot retreat or go forward or turn to the right or the left?

In looking at the text God's word for us is to "Stand firm". The best one can do is listen to God's word. There will be other voices offering suggestions. Despair will come whispering, "Give up--lie down and quit". However, even in the worst of times, God would rather have us cheerful and courageous, rejoicing in His love and faithfulness. The Apostle Paul talks about this.

Cowardice will come and tell us to retreat to the world's way of acting. That the Christian way of living is too demanding. The challenge then becomes to stand firm against the pressures of Satan and to remember that God is in control and that we are not alone.

Impatience tells us to get up and do something. To stand firm and wait is sheer idleness. In a 24/7 world this does not make sense. However, the good news is that in standing firm not only will God do something but He will do everything!

Arrogance will say that if something is blocking the way, march into it and expect a miracle. Yet, true faith never listens to arrogance, impatience, cowardice, or despair but only hears God saying, "Stand firm." Standing firm on God and His word is as immovable as a rock.

In the meantime and in the times of uncertainty we are to wait. If there is any doubt--wait, never forcing yourself into action. If you sense any restraining on your spirit, do not go against it--wait until the way is clear. God is good and will provide.



Operating Fund – March receipts were \$21,316; disbursements were \$24,364 for net disbursements of (\$3,048). Year to date receipts were \$56,979; disbursements were \$75,525 for net disbursements of (\$18,545). The Operating Fund balance was \$11,886 at January 1, 2018 and was negative (\$6,659) at March 31, 2018.

Building Fund – March receipts were \$1,549; disbursements were \$1,020 for net receipts of \$529. Year to date receipts were \$5,740; disbursements were \$3,060 for net receipts of \$2,680. The Building Fund balance was \$3,128 at January 1, 2018 and was \$5,808 at March 31, 2018.

Carpeting Fund – March receipts were \$40. There were no disbursements. Year to date receipts were \$5,138. There were no disbursements. The Carpeting Fund balance was negative (\$5,054) at January 1, 2018 and was \$84 at March 31, 2018.

Unrestricted Cash Balances – total \$59,201 as of March 31, 2018. The accounts are held at Investors Community Bank, Appleton, WI.

Restricted Cash Balances – Pynch Memorial Fund – is \$10,005 as of March 31, 2018. Of \$10,000 is to be maintained forever. Earnings on the account are to be used for kitchen supplies and library materials. The account is held at Investors Community Bank, Appleton, WI.

Mortgage Balance – The mortgage balance on March 31, 2018 is \$84,584. Payments of \$1,020 (principal and interest at 4.750 percent) are due on the 25th of each month. The final payment is due September 25, 2020. The mortgage is held by Investors Community Bank.


Summer is coming

The Lost Sheep



Theme: Jesus never gives up on a lost sheep.

Scripture: Then Jesus told them this parable: "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Does he not leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent. Luke 15:3-7

Many children make a hobby out of collecting things. For example, they may collect things such as coins, stamps, baseball cards, dolls, or miniature cars. Some may even collect items from nature like bugs, butterflies, or sea shells. Have you ever collected anything? I have a very nice collection of stuffed toys. They come in all shapes and sizes. Animals are my favorites. Sometimes, I think I have lost one of my stuffed toys. But, they usually show up. Do you have stuffed animals at home. Do you ever loose one of them. Do you ask your brothers and sisters to help you look for them? Do you say thank you so much for helping me find the lost toy. Even though I have a very large collection, every one of them is very important to me and I would be very upset if one of them was lost.

That reminds me of a lesson that Jesus taught to a group of religious leaders one day. The religious leaders were very upset that Jesus was often seen associating with sinners. He was even sometimes seen eating with them. The religious leaders didn't like that at all and were very critical of Jesus. Jesus told them a story to help them to understand.

"Suppose one of you had a hundred sheep and you lost one of them," Jesus said. "Wouldn't you leave the ninety-nine who were safe, and go and search for the lost sheep? And when you found the lost sheep, wouldn't you joyfully put it on your shoulders and carry it back home? Wouldn't you be so happy that you would tell all of your friends about finding the lost sheep?" I imagine that all of the religious leaders had to agree that they would do just as Jesus had suggested. Then Jesus said to them, "In the same way, there is more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent."

The Bible teaches us that we are like sheep and sometimes stray away from God. That makes God very sad, but he never gives up on us. He keeps searching for us and calling to us. He wants to draw us back into his arms. He even sent Jesus, his Son, to save those who are lost. Aren't you glad that God doesn't give up on his lost sheep? I am, because "I once was lost, but now I'm found!"


Dear Jesus, you are the Good Shepherd. We are thankful that you came to save those who are lost. Amen.
