

Greetings Faith Church,

Christ is born and a new year has begun! Because of Covid, the last two years have been somewhat foggy and confusing for all of us. Now, I have to confess that this Advent/Christmas season was the best one that I have been involved with since I have been in the ordained ministry. Previously, I have said the Christmas words about Jesus birth, been part of Christmas programs as a youth, opened gifts at Christmas and then December 26th came and everything was over. Then the dog days of winter set in. I forgot this, my birthday came in January, and that was a brief pause for a day!

This year I got a better understanding of what the Incarnation was all about and what it means personally. God is good! During the now completed Incarnation series, I was using a book by Adam Hamilton entitled the Incarnation, Rediscovering the Significance of Christmas. Something I did not have time to talk about was that question why do we celebrate Christmas on December 25th? Now no one exactly knows the day that Jesus was born. Because during Jesus time in Jewish culture people did not ordinarily celebrate birthdays nor were certificates issued by the government recording a child's birth. However, the winter solstice begins on December 22 and winter begins and we know that this is the shortest day of the year! The good news with that is on the 23rd the days begin to get longer! The light is piercing in and moving out the darkness just as Jesus birth is the light and the darkness cannot overcome it. A light that shines into the dark corners of our lives. With Christ's birth we have a light to blot out the darkness of sin.

For this we can be thankful. As we/you begin the new year, the last three sentence from my devotional reading from December 26th help with how we should begin the new with gratitude. It said this: "...So whenever you are counting your blessings, be sure to include the infinite wealth you have in Me. Add Me into the equation, and your gratitude will grow exponentially. Whatever you have + Me= an incalculable fortune! With Christ's birth we many blessings have much to be thankful for.

#### Children's Message

Jesus tells us which is the greatest commandment.

#### Scripture

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: " 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'

Rules are very important, aren't they? Whether you are at school, at work, or play there are rules that you are expected to follow. In just about every classroom that I have ever been in, there is a poster on the wall like this one with a list of rules that the teacher expects the students to follow. (Read the rules to the children.)

I think that is a pretty good list of rules, don't you? Which one of these rules do you think is the most important? (Allow some feedback.) Which rule do you think your teacher would think is most important? Well, if you were to ask me, I would say that the most important rule is "be kind and respect one another."

The people in Jesus' day had to follow rules too. One day a lawyer asked Jesus, "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment?" How many commandments there are? There are ten, aren't there? Well, there were ten that Moses wrote on the tablets of stone and we call them the Ten Commandments, but the Jews actually had 613 laws. There were 248 dos and 365 don'ts. Wow! That is a lot of dos and don'ts isn't it? Can you imagine trying to remember all of them? Six hundred thirteen laws! Which one do you think Jesus said was the most important? Listen to what Jesus said to the lawyer.

Jesus answered him, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind,' this is the greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." In other words, Jesus was saying that if we could keep these two commandments, we would not have any trouble keeping the others.

It isn't easy to keep the commandments, is it? We need God's help each and every day. Let's pray and ask him to help us to love as he has commanded us.

Dear Father, help us to love you with all of our heart and to love our neighbors as we love ourselves. Amen.
