# CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

Theme: God is our help in time of trouble

Psalms 46:1 God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.



I thought that today we might have a little math lesson. Since I know that some of you have already started to school, I know that you have studied math. I am going to give you a problem and if you know the answer write it down, at the end use the calculator and see if you are right.

- 1 + 1 = \_\_\_\_ Great, here's another one.
- 2 + 2 = \_\_\_\_ Oh, these are too easy. Try this one!
- 2 x 2 = \_\_\_\_ That's great! You guys are smart!
- 3 x 4 = \_\_\_\_ Good job! Now here's another one.
- 27 x 9 = \_\_\_\_ (How did you do—do you know the answer....

You may need help with the last one. (Take out your calculator) Let's see,  $27 \times 9 = 243$ . That was a pretty difficult problem, so we had to have a little help from the calculator. There is nothing wrong with that. We all need help sometimes.

Every day we face problems in our life. Some of them are easy problems like "What shall I wear to school today?" or "Should I have Fruit Loops or Cheerios for breakfast?" But sooner or later, we will have a problem that we just don't know how to solve. We will need help. Isn't it good to know that God is always there to help us solve those problems. The Bible tells us that God is always there to help us not us in times of trouble. All we have to do is pray and He will give us the answer.

**Where:** The Family's Help for the Homeless hygiene drive takes place in 15 communities in our listening areas; Appleton/Fox Cities, Antigo, Chilton, Fond du Lac, Green Bay/Brown County, Manitowoc, Marshfield, Marathon County/Wausau, Oconto/Marinette, Oshkosh, Seymour, Sheboygan, Stevens Point, Waupaca, and Wisconsin Rapids. Donations remain in communities where collected.

**How:** Local churches, employers, and schools place collection boxes in their high traffic areas and encourage their staff, members, students and friends to donate hygiene/cleaning products to help local crisis programs.

#### **Quick Summary of November 2020 Financial Information**

**Operating Fund** – Nov receipts were \$22,937; disbursements were \$21,768 for net receipts of \$1,169. Year to date receipts were \$277,414; disbursements were \$239,862 for net receipts of \$37,552 The Operating Fund balance was \$20,307 at January 1, 2020 and was \$57,859 at Nov 30, 2020.

**Building Fund –** Nov receipts were \$794; disbursements were \$610 for net receipts of \$184. Year to date receipts were \$5,880; disbursements were \$18,400 for net disbursements of \$12,521. The Building Fund balance was \$16,285 at January 1, 2020 and was \$3,752 at Nov 30, 2020.

**Carpeting Fund** – Nov receipts were \$0. There were no disbursements. Year to date receipts were \$205. There were no disbursements. The Carpeting Fund balance was \$939 at January 1, 2020 and was \$1,144 at Nov 30, 2020.

**Unrestricted Cash Balances** – total \$121,346 as of Nov 30, 2020. The accounts are held at Investors Community Bank, Appleton, WI.

**Restricted Cash Balances** – Pynch Memorial Fund – is \$10,080 as of Nov 30, 2020. Principal of \$10,000 is to be maintained forever. Earnings on the account are to be used for kitchen supplies and library materials. The account is held at Investors Community Bank, Appleton, WI.

**Mortgage Balance** – The mortgage balance on Nov 30, 2020 is \$54,547. Payments of \$610 are due on the 25th of each month. The mortgage is held by Investors Community Bank.
