### **ADVENT IS HERE**

ADVENT is here! You ask, "What is advent?!"

As far as the timing of advent, advent is a season which starts off the Christian calendar year. It is the four Sundays which precede Christmas Eve and includes Christmas Eve.

As far as the purpose of the season, advent is the time when the church focuses on the prophecies and the events leading up to the birth of Jesus.

Advent means "the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event." In Christians circles, the notable person is the baby Jesus. Advent also includes the return of or the second coming of Jesus when he comes back to earth to rid the world of evil, but our focus in the season of advent is on his first arrival.

As far as the biblical focus on advent, there are Old Testament scriptures which talk about the coming Messiah. Some prophecies come from as far back as Adam and Eve. (Depending on how you understand the time of Adam & Eve, a literal reading of Genesis could be as far back as 4000 B.C.E before Jesus.) Some are just over 400 years or more before Jesus was born. Then there are the more recent events that led up to Jesus' birth such as Angels visiting Zachariah, Mary, Joseph, the shepherds and the Magi.

This advent, we have an advent devotional created by your writings. Take one for yourself and then take some to give away to family, neighbors, and friends. Let them know that these devotions are to help us prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth. Use these with others, and then try to enter into conversations about some of the devotions you have read with those you hand them out to. Have fun with them. Use them to spark conversations. Then ask the people you give them to, to join you on Christmas Eve to a service celebrating Jesus' birth. More people will come to Christmas Eve service when asked than you think.

May God bless you this advent season as you use the 2025 Advent Devotional daily. May God bless those to whom you give a devotional away to. May God bless your invitations to Christmas Eve services.

May God simply bless you and your loved ones this season of advent.

### Children's Sermon: Ready for the Christ of Christmas (Matthew 3:1-12)

Today we're going to talk about what it means to be ready. What does it look like when we're ready? That's right! Being ready means that we are patient, we wait, and we watch. Okay, are you ready to start our lesson today? "I see you're ready because you are waiting patiently" or "I see you're ready because you are watching me." Are you ready for Christmas?

You will hear that question many times over the next several weeks. Let's find out what people mean when they ask that question. Raise your hand if your Christmas tree is up and your house is decorated. Raise your hand if you've finished your Christmas shopping. Raise your hand if you've been practicing for a Christmas program. There's another question that we should be asking ourselves today. It's more important than "Are you ready for Christmas?" The more important question is "Are you ready for the Christ of Christmas?" Many years ago, a man named John the Baptist preached about what it means to be ready for Jesus. Are you ready to answer a question?

What do you think it means to be ready for Jesus? John the Baptist was a different kind of man. He wore clothes made of camel's hair with a belt around his waist. His diet was rather unusual as well. He ate a diet of locusts and wild honey. Do you know what a locust is? Many of us today might call it a grasshopper. I'm not sure I would want to eat grasshoppers and honey. How about you?

John the Baptist traveled throughout the wilderness of Judea. His message to the people was to get ready for Jesus. John would shout loudly, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near." Are you ready for Jesus? Many people were ready for Jesus. So they came to John the Baptist. They confessed their sins to God and were baptized by John in the Jordan River. After John baptized the people, he told them, "I baptize you with water for repentance. But there is one coming who is more powerful than I. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." Are you ready for Jesus this Christmas?

During this special season of the year as we get ready for Christmas, you and I need to make sure we're ready for the coming of the Christ of Christmas. We need to look into our hearts and ask God to make us clean so we can walk with Jesus each day of our life. Let's ask him to do that now.

Dear God, we want to be ready for the Christ of Christmas. Prepare our hearts for his coming. In Jesus' name we pray, amen.






### December 12th:
